A4 - Going Digital: Involving the citizen

About this session...

The aim of this session is to bring everyone up to date on the development of the European Student Card Initiative and the European Solidarity Corps, and to gather ideas on how to improve the online journey of young people through the different parts of the Erasmus+ programme and the European Solidarity Corps. We will look into the existing digital ecosystem including portals, mobile apps, and social media channels through which citizens can get information on mobilities, apply for opportunities, access services, and interact with each other, with organisations and with the European Commission. We will then explore together how to further improve this experience for our citizens.

Something to think about...

Citizens have the possibility to participate in multiple parts of the Erasmus+ programme at different stages in their lives, (for instance in a school exchange, in DiscoverEU, a VET training, a university student exchange, a youth exchange, or a youth participation project), as well as in the European Solidarity Corps.

At present, these are all handled separately, but would it be of interest to create something online that allows participants and National Agencies to get involved with all of these parts? To be able to manage all of their mobility experiences in one space? To comprehensively document their learning experiences? To interact with each other, with organisations, and with the Commission?

If so, what could this do, and how?
